Curriculum vitae

I was born in 1957 in Stuttgart. After high school (Gymnasium), 18 months of service in a hospital, and extensive travels to the USA, Latin America and Southeast Asia, I studied political science, economics, and contemporary history at the Universities of Denver and Tübingen where I graduated in 1988. During and after my university studies, I worked as a personal assistant for several members of parliament in Germany and the USA. From 1990-92, I wrote my doctoral dissertation at the University of Tübingen.

In 1992 I became personal assistant (Persönlicher Referent) of the Minister of the Interior of Baden-Württemberg. In the years 1996 to 1999, I worked as a specialist (Referent) at the Ministry of the Interior of Baden-Württemberg and as a guest lecturer (Lehrbeauftragter) at the University of Tübingen.

Since 1999, I have been teaching management, leadership, and Human Resource Management at the German Police University (former Polizei-Führungsakademie) in Münster-Hiltrup. My field of expertise includes issues such as performance measurement in the police, strategic management, change management, and leadership issues. My research focuses on change processes in the police.

I have published extensively on management issues in the police and held numerous lectures on national and international conferences.
