Fredrik Nygren, deputy commissioner from the Swedish National Police Board, is working as a special Adviser in the Ministry of Justice, Police Division, since 2006. His main responsibility is Europol but he also holds a horizontal responsibility for International Information Exchange and IT-development. This includes work with Prüm, Criminal Registers, different expert and ad hoc groups and several Swedish initiatives for a more efficient information exchange and IT-development within the European Union.

Mr. Nygren joined the Swedish Police in 1989. After several operational positions at local and regional level he came to the National Criminal Investigation Department in 1995 as a Deputy Head (later Head) of Operations. In 1998 Mr. Nygren started working in the area of Business and IT Development and in 2000 he became a Deputy Commissioner and Head of development at the National Police Board. He engaged particularly in the implementation of modern methods and models for business driven development. From 2003 to 2005 he was co-ordinator of international IT development within the National Police Board. During this period he also studied for a master's degree in the field of “Management for Quality and Change”.

Mr. Nygren has been a delegate to different law enforcement working parties since Swedens accession to the EU in 1995 and he was head of the Swedish delegation to the Police Co-operation Working Party during the first Swedish EU-presidency in 2001. He attended the 183:rd session of the FBI National Academy.

Mr. Nygren was born in Lidköping in western Sweden in 1960. He holds degrees of LL.M (Uppsala) and M.B.A. (Växjö) and he is a Captain of the Signal Corps Reserve. He lives with his wife and three children outside Stockholm.
