**Curriculum vitae**

Klaus-Dieter Tietz, \*1958, Police Colonel and Lecturer since March 2007 at the Academy for Crises Management, Emergency Planning and Civil Protection in Bad Neuenahr-Ahrweiler (AKNZ). The AKNZ is part of the Federal Office of Civil Protection and Disaster Assistance in Bonn. He is serving in the Department of Leadership and Management. His tasks: Training of Non-Policing Agencies (fire-brigades, ambulances, district administrations and counties); Cooperation with the police in crises situations; Civilian-Military Cooperation (CIMIC) as Police expert and to build a Bridge between Police and Non-Policing Agencies.

From February 2006 to February 2007 he was Member in the European Union Police Mission (EUPM) in Bosnia and Herzegovina as German Contingent Commander. As Chief Advisers' Coordinator, Deputy Chief of Staff and Deputy Chief Anti-Organised Crime Department he was heading the EU ESDP Targeting Board with close cooperation to other International Partners (EUFOR, OSCE, CAFAO, State Prosecutor and International Prosecutors, ICTY). Dealing with Chiefs of the local police and the Ministries of both entities as well as the state level in the fight against organised crime and corruption. Responsible for the operational part of the Mission.

In 2004 and 2005 in the frame of EU-CARDS 2002 he held three courses to advise the commissioners of entities, SIPA, SBS and the police academy. It was a training program about leadership and police management.

From 2002 to 2006 he was lecturer at the “Polizei-Fuehrungsakademie” in Muenster which is the senior police academy of the Federal Republic of Germany in the department of police management. Lecturer and co-leader for several CEPOL-seminars (Collège Européen de Police) in The Netherlands, Great Britain, Poland, Latvia with the focus on crowd management and disaster management.

Since 1991 after finishing the two years study at the Polizei-Fuehrungsakademie in Muenster he was working as senior police officer in the state of Lower Saxony. Chief of uniformed police in the county of Rotenburg, Deputy Chief of Police in the county of Rotenburg, Responsible for Public Relations and Conflict Management in large scale police operations (eg. CASTOR-Transport of atomic waste to the temporary storage in Gorleben, extortions and hostage-taking). Lecturer at the university of applied sciences for Public Administration, faculty police, Hildesheim, in Constitutional Law and Human Rights as well as Leadership and Management. Chief of operations (shift) for the World Exposition (EXPO 2000) in Hanover.

Police Officer since 1979 in Lower Saxony starting as Inspector after a three years study at the university of applied sciences for Public Administration, faculty police, and finishing with the “Dipl. Verwaltungswirt (FH)” degree (equivalent to bachelor degree).
