Dr. Katharina von Knop will start in January as a fellow of the University of the Armed Forces, Germany. She is on the research board at the Jebesen Center for Counter-Terrorism Studies at the Fletcher School, Tufts University in Boston. Additionally she is serving as a FP7 consultant at the EU Commission. She served as an Adjunct Professor at the George C. Marshall European Center for Security Studies, Program on Terrorism and Security Studies. She holds a PhD on Political Science with the focus on Terrorism and Counterterrorism, a MA in Political Science, and a BA in Communication Science, Sociology and Political Science. She has published four books on terrorism and counterterrorism as well as 17 scientific reviewed articles. Dr. von Knop is teaching at civilian and military higher education institutions in various countries. She has presented at the International Studies Conference multiple times as well as at the American Political Studies Association Annual Convention. In September 2006 she has organized together with Dr. Boaz Ganor a NATO advance research workshop on “Hypermedia Seduction for Terrorist Recruiting” in Eilat, Israel. Her current research includes complex dynamic security systems, the investigation of women inside terrorist organizations, the effectiveness of current counterterrorism measures and hypermedia seduction for terrorist recruiting and the countering of web-based Islamist activities.
